

## Opportunities for Giving to Congregation Beth Sholom

A number of funds are managed by Congregation Beth Sholom that promote scholarship programs, library development, and other educational programs. The funds also provide an opportunity for members to donate to charitable causes and to a wide range of programs important to the ongoing activities of the community.

*Ayin L'Tzion Fund:* Heightens Israel awareness and involvement and increases support for the Masorti (Conservative) Movement in Israel. Supports programs at Congregation Beth Sholom related to Israel and Zionism, including the annual Yom Ha'atzmaut celebration.

*Alfred & Rose Buchman Fine Arts Fund:* Established by the children of Alfred and Rose Buchman to support a visual and fine arts program held each spring in their memory.

*Alice Hereld Cahn Education Fund:* Supports a Scholar-in-Residence each fall. The fund was established by Curtis Herald as a tribute to his beloved mother.

*Children's Programming Fund:* Covers cultural, religious, and social services for Junior Congregation. The fund is used for Shabbat and holiday programming.

*Endowment Fund:* Provide long-term financial support for Congregation Beth Sholom through contributions and bequests.

*Fred Friesner Maot Hittim Fund:* Provides fund to members of the synagogue who are having difficulty providing food provisions to their family, especially around Passover.

*General Fund:* Supports operational expenses of the synagogue.

*Hazak Fund:* Supports Congregation Beth Sholom's group for seniors, who meet to share common concerns, discover interesting places, and have a good time together. Members enjoy a variety of social and interactive programs throughout the year.

*Hesed Fund:* Covers meals and other services extended to Congregation Beth Sholom members at a time of death, illness, or a birth.

*Kiddish Fund:* Makes it possible to hold *Shabbat Kiddiush* on weeks when it is not specifically sponsored.

*Max and Ruth Klingenstein Children's Education Fund:* Supports special children's programs throughout the year. Established in memory of Max and Ruth Klingenstein, the fund helps ensure that their passion for Judaism would be passed down to future generations.

*Library Fund:* Supports the acquisition of books for the Congregation Beth Sholom library.

*M&M Fund:* Established by the Morgenstern and Melamed families at Congregation Beth Israel in 2004 to commemorate the observance of *Yom HaShoah*.

*Rob Moss Purim Award Fund:* Supports an annual writing contest for Congregation Beth Sholom students relating to the story of Purim. The award is named in memory of Rob Moss; his mother, Margo, is a member of Congregation Beth Sholom.

*Prayer Book Fund:* Provides funds for the purchase of new prayer books and *Humashim*. Money can be donated in honor or in memory of a loved one.

*Rabbi's Discretionary Fund:* Supports a variety of charitable organizations and programs in the community.

*Barry Reis Scholarship Fund:* Provides financial support for children to attend Jewish programs at summer camps and in Israel.

*Russian Club Fund:* Supports a connection to *Yiddishkeit* for Jewish immigrants from the former Soviet Union living in the greater Teaneck community. Members celebrate events including Jewish holidays and the Day of Victory in World War II. The club also has its own chorus.

*Rabbi Barry Schaeffer Fund:* An endowment fund which supports the Scholar-in-Residence program.

*Albert M. and Ida Shulman Scholarship Fund:* Provides annual merit awards for travel to Israel to one or two teenagers, between ages 15 to 17, from Congregation Beth Sholom. Applicants must submit an application, with a letter or recommendation and personal essay, and participate in a program approved by the selection committee.

*Torah Fund:* Begun with funds raised in memory of Rabbi Barry Schaeffer, this fund supports the repair and maintenance of Torah Scrolls at Congregation Beth Sholom.

*Tikkun Olam/Social Action Fund:* Supports the ongoing projects of the Tikkun Olam Committee.

*Tzipporei Shalom Fund:* Provides financial support for the Children's Choir at Congregation Beth Shalom.
